The purpose of the Guggenheim Fellowship is to provide Fellows with **blocks of time** in which they can work with **as much creative freedom as possible**. As such, grants are made freely, without any special conditions attached to them; Fellows may spend their grant funds in any manner they deem necessary to their work.

Do I have a project in mind for this application?  Applicants in the arts will be asked to submit a brief statement of plans describing the proposed artistic project, not exceeding three pages in length. Financial considerations will not play a part in their evaluations.

## **GRANT COMP STATS:**

**Guggenheim Fellowship:** 2,500 Applicants in 2023; 175 Fellows in all disciplines, award varies; (National. Scientists, writers, scholars, and artists.) Career and project-based.

In 2023: In all, **48** scholarly disciplines and artistic fields, **72** different academic institutions, **24** states and the District of Columbia, and two Canadian provinces are represented in this year's class of Fellows, who range in age from **31 to 85**. Close to **50** Fellows have no current full-time college or university affiliation. Many Fellows' projects directly respond to issues like the lasting effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, democracy and policing, scientific innovation, climate change, and identity.

**Creative Capital Award**: 5,000+ applicants in 2023; 50 projects \$15,000 to \$50,000 plus \$50,000 in advisory services (National); Project Based.

**Harpo Foundation Grants for Visual Artists**: 1,600 applicants in 2019; grants up to \$10,000, average grant is \$8,000 (National); Average 7 grantees each cycle.

**Ellis Beauregard Foundation:** 300 Applicants in 2023; \$50,000 Fellowship, 1 grantee each year.
